violence, will not be tolerated.


Anyone giving verbal abuse to staff members will be told to leave the premises.

It is time to renew your application for On-Reserve Income Assistance for the new fiscal year. Anyone who feels that they are in financial need is welcome to *apply*, you just need to keep in mind that there is an INCOME VERIFICATION process that has to take place which can take up to 10 business days to process.

- ➤ If you are living in a Marriage-like relationship than you must apply as a family unit.
- ➤ If you or your spouse either work, go to school and get school allowance, collect E.I., collect Pension, then you are NOT eligible for On-Reserve Income Assistance.
- ➤ If you or your spouse turn down a work opportunity, quit work or get fired for "just" cause than you are NOT eligible for On-Reserve Income Assistance.



Department of Indigenous Services Canada

(Indian affairs)

The Department of Indigenous Services Canada (DISC) is our Funding Service Provider and they provide staff with a policy and procedures manual. The Manual provides information on what is allowed and what is not allowed.

Staff members, Chief and Council or our Band Manager have no Authority to make changes to DISC's manual.

Shared Shelter

If there is more than one Family Unit that lives in your home than you are sharing the shelter costs. We can only pay for those who are Income Assistance Clients. Other persons or their spouse who is either:

- Working
- Collecting Pension
- > Collecting E.I.
- Going to school and collecting school living allowance

Must pay their own share of the costs.

*** There is more to this list. I have only listed the most common for our community. Please inquire with staff about ineligibility.





AS PER CHAPTER 4 OF THE POLICY AND PROCEDURES MANUAL, IF YOU OR YOUR SPOUSE ARE:

- Working
- ❖ Collecting E.I.
- Collecting pension

- Turn down full time work
- Quit full time work
- ❖ Get fired for "just" cause
- Collecting school allowance

Then you are NOT eligible for On-Reserve Income Assistance.

This also means that we can NOT pay your share of the Hydro, CMHC, PFN Housing Authority, Wood order.

Even if the Hydro Bill is in the name of an S/A Client you STILL need to pay **your** share.



SHARED SHELTER

In this home we have 3 family units who live in the home.

Total of 6 people live in the home

Hydro = 790.45 / 6 = \$131.74 per person.

As per chapters 5 in the manual, we do *NOT* pay for employed family or the pensioner. We *only* pay for the S/A client.

Employed family = 131.74 x 4 = \$526.96

Pensioner = $131.74 \times 1 \$ 131.74$

 $S/A client = 131.74 \times 1 = 131.74

as per chapter 5 in the Policy Manual we do NOT pay for employed persons

Employed person pays \$59.37

Employed couple pays \$118.74

S/A client \$59.37

We can only pay for the S/A client \$59.37

IMPORTANT

Even if the Hydro bill is in the name of an S/A client. The Other Person's in the home are responsible for their share of the cost.

We do our absolute best not to go over a clients' SHELTER MAXIMUM but be aware if we are to go over a shelter maximum for any reason, it has to be DEDUCTED from the S/A clients' welfare cheque, like I mentioned we do our best not to exceed a clients' shelter max.





CHANGE REPORTS

A change report is just as it sounds, when change occurs it is the clients' responsibility to update their s/a file.

If You or someone who lives in the home:

- Had a baby
- Moved in or moved out of a home
- Full time employment

- Goes to school AND gets living allowance
- Turns 19 or 65 years of age
- Someone has passed away.

All s/a clients in the home are responsible to update their s/a file of the changes.

Please be aware that we have prioritized Hydro bills over firewood. This means if you did NOT get any firewood when you asked Your hydro bill was too high and you did not have enough shelter allowance for a load of wood. WE WOULD RATHER YOU HAVE HYDRO ON THAN TO BE CUT OFF.

IF YOUR HYDRO IS TOO HIGH THEN NO WOOD WILL BE DELIVERED.

STUBS

Also known as Monthly Renewal Declaration. Are due the Friday before cheque day. This allows staff time to ensure correctness and/or make the appropriate changes.





FIREWOOD

YOU WILL NEED TO BRING WITH YOU:

- >PHOTOCOPY OF I.D. 2 FOR ADULTS, 1 FOR CHILDREN, CANNOT BE EXPIRED.
- ➤BANK STATEMENT W/30 DAYS OF TRANSACTIONS
- >MOST RECENT INCOME TAX SUMMARY
- DR'S NOTE IF APPLICABLE
- >PWD DESIGNATION LETTER
- >PPMB DR'S REPORT

Please note* you may be required to submit additional supporting/essential documents. We have only listed the most common for our community. Inquire with staff on supporting/essential documents.

WITHOUT THE SUPPORTING/ESSENTIAL DOCUMENTS YOUR FILE WILL BE "INCOMPLETE"

TO AVOID DELAY WE HIGHLY RECOMMEND THAT YOU COME IN WITH ALL DOCUMENTATION IN HAND.

NO "I WILL BRING IT IN ON MONDAY" PROMISES WILL BE ACCEPTED.


If anything happens in the next while, I will post news to the Penelakut Community Forum.

Summary to create a better understanding of the Day Scholar and Day Schools Class Actions:

The Day Scholar Class Action was certified under Common Experience based upon the loss of indigenous language and culture.

The two closely related class actions are the Day Scholars and Day Schools.

The **Day Scholars/Gottfriedson** class action is brought on behalf of students who attended Indian Residential Schools but during the day only and returned home every night. This lawsuit unfortunately has not settled.

The Day Scholars/Gottfriedson class action is ongoing, there is nothing that the class members need to do right now, but they can fill out the form found on the website so that it is easier to communicate with them if and when the case does resolve. http://justicefordayscholars.com/

The one that recently settled was the **Day Schools/McLean** class action brought on behalf of students who attended Indian Day Schools during the day. That proposed settlement has to be approved by a court before it is finalized and before any individuals can apply for compensation. 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Healing one heart, one mind, & one spirit at a time!

As many of you may have heard we have an epidemic lice infestation with our young ones at the school. Roughly 90% of the kids attending the school have eggs and/or mature lice. We have taken steps and we have implemented a plan to help resolve this problem.

While we believe we can eliminate this situation we will need help from families and community members to help keep the lice away for as long as possible. We are asking families to comb through their kid's hair to manually remove eggs and do some light cleaning at home.

Changing pillow cases, washing bed sheets and frequently used sweaters/jackets might be of benefit for out little ones to prevent lice from recurring. Your help in this process is crucial as not everyone carrying lice are attending the schools. There, we need help from everyone in order to get a handle on this lice outbreak.

Please contact myself or other staff members if you see any lice. Our goal is to make our community as healthy as possible. We need to help our children and show them how to be as healthy and as clean as possible. It is our job as parents and responsible adults to create a clean environment for our little ones.




